NOMINATION OF CANDIDATE FOR 2018 NATIONAL SHEEP FARMER OF THE YEAR

REQUIREMENTS

- The candidate must be a leading farmer in their area and must set an example for their peers.
- The candidate's management practices and results must serve as a benchmark.
- Any farmer can be nominated as long as fellow farmers can identify with the candidate.
- The candidate must be willing to receive farmers on his farm and to present a farmers' day in cooperation with the organisations involved in the competition.

PROCEDURE

- Complete the attached form.
- Keep it confidential and do not discuss this nomination with the candidate, as it may create an expectation.
- Candidate information is submitted to a panel of independent judges.
- The panel nominates three finalists whose farms they will visit in order to determine who the National Sheep Farmer of the Year will be.
- The following aspects will be considered during final adjudication: utilisation of resources, fodder flow planning, pasture management, breeding and selection standards, record-keeping, benchmarking, marketing and value addition, flock production, physical appearance of animals, infrastructure, labour management and participation in organised agriculture.
- The panel's decision is final and no reasons or comments will be made available to candidates.
